It concerns trans-generational trauma in a book in which a child, who was born after World War II, learned that he had a brother who perished during the Holocaust.

Evy Mayer's cousin, Danny Lyon, is a photographer whose work is currently being shown at the Whitney Museum of American Art. The exhibit of 175 photographs is entitled “Danny Lyon: Message to the Future.” It will be on view at the Whitney until September 25, 2016.
