JOE & DANNY ELIAS; Friday, October 4th; 8 PM

The Ladino language evolved from ancient Castilian among Sephardic Jews expelled from Spain in 1492. Ladino music evolved with the language. Vocalist and guitarist Joe Elias is one of the very few contemporary performers of Ladino music who has learned his material through oral and instrumental traditions transmitted from generation to generation. His son Danny is an extraordinary clarinet player. Presented with the cooperation of Polytechnic University: Adm: \$13 (members, \$10, Polytech students free).

At: Polytechnic University, Wunsch Hall, just over the Brooklyn or Manhattan bridges in Brooklyn; right off the Tillary St. exit from the BQE. By train: A, C, F (Jay St.–Borough Hall) and M, N, R (Lawrence Street) are closest. #2, 3, 4, 5 are five min. walk (Borough Hall). All are 1st or 2nd stop in Brooklyn, 15-20 min. from midtown Manhattan. Go into the open Metrotech Commons—right across from the Marriott. The student center (Wunsch Hall) is at the far end of the Commons, beyond the trees, looks like an old brown church (which it was); next to a new building under construction. Street parking is free after 7 on Jay St., Tillary St., or Flatbush Ave. Flatbush Ave 2 blocks south of Tillary Street has lots of meters which are legal after 7 pm (but tow-away before). If you park on Flatbush, walk into the commons 2 blocks West past the Chase Bank building. The Bank will be on your left, and a new building will be on your immediate right. Turn right at the corner of the new building and continue to the next building. The student center will be right there. Info: (718) 549-1344 (after 11 AM).

COOPE, BOYES, AND SIMPSON; Thursday, Oct 10th; 8 pm☺

Since their first appearance in 1993, Barry Coope, Jim Boyes, and Lester Simpson's powerful and distinctive unaccompanied singing and songwriting have taken English roots into radical new directions. Described as "quite simply the best purveyors of a cappella song on these islands," the trio's first record, *Funny Old World*, was the rock magazine *Q's* Roots Album of the Year, while their live debut on BBC Radio Four drew praise from the classical composer Steve Martland. They have subsequently appeared on television, in concert, and at festivals throughout Great Britain, Germany, Denmark, the Netherlands, Belgium, Portugal, France, and the United States. In addition to established folk music venues, Coope, Boyes, and Simpson have performed at historic sites, such as the York Minster, the Rochester Cathedral, and the Bodmin Jail. Now they are coming to America for just 13 days, and we are proud to host their only New York appearance of the tour.

TRIBUTE TO ALAN LOMAX

Special Friday night event at the NOMAD Festival, Friday, October 25, 2002, 7:30 p.m. to be held at Newtown High School, Newtown, Connecticut.

On July 19, 2002, Alan Lomax, one of the giants of folk music collecting, died at the age of 87. Lomax was the first to record such legendary figures as Leadbelly, Muddy Waters and Woody Guthrie, but his importance went far beyond those famous names. This tribute will feature a unique recording, provided by John Langstaff, of Lomax giving a talk for an audience of cowboys, about how his father John A. Lomax first became interested in the songs of the cowboys around his home in Texas. The elder Lomax went on to be one of the first heads of the Library of Congress Archive of Folk Song.

Also featured will be songs and reminiscences by Jeff and Gerret Warner, whose parents were themselves among America's greatest collectors and who worked with Lomax over the course of many decades. Others of the NOMAD performers will also contribute; the event will be coordinated by Jerry Epstein, who will also play a recording of probably the last time Alan Lomax sang in public, in the wild and primitive way that moves the heart. This special event at NOMAD promises to be a historic occasion.
