## **CARL SCHWARTZ, 1952-2008**

Just as we were going to press we learned that our dear friend Carl Schwartz passed away suddenly on the morning of February 15 at the age of 55. The cause of death was heart failure.

Carl and his life partner Jeanne Stork have been New York Pinewoods Folk Music Club members on and off for many years. Although he loved to sing and play harmonica, Carl was more of a music activist than a musician. He was deeply involved with the Hudson River Sloop Clearwater and with its local affiliate, the New York City Friends of Clearwater, and he organized several successful musical fundraisers for them. In 2000, for example, Carl produced the "Ships to Save the Waters" concert which featured Pete Seeger, David Amram, and Paul Winter, among others, and which brought in thousands of dollars for the Clearwater and two other environmental boats.

Carl's birthday was in December, and each year he celebrated it with a big party at District Council 37 headquarters in Lower Manhattan. There would always be lots of music, and often some very well known folk musicians would come to perform as a favor for Carl.

Carl Schwartz was one of the good guys, one of the very good guys. We will miss him dearly.

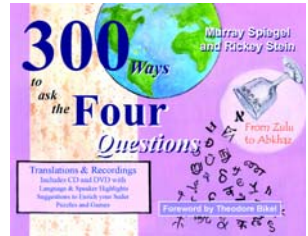

## “300 Ways to Ask the Four Questions”

by Murray Spiegel/Rickey Stein

This is an amazing achievement. "Why is this night different...?" The "Four Questions" are at the heart of each Passover seder, and these two gents have co-authored this delightful, quite handsome book (with CD and DVD included). This modern Rosetta Stone, a 25 year labor of love, has an enthusiastic Foreword by Theodore Bikel. It's a beautifully produced illustrated volume, mostly serious -- hundreds of living languages and a few dead ones -- plus 22 amusing made-up languages like Lawyerese, Valley Girl, Klingon, semaphore, pig latin, and more. Among the serious examples are a few poignant ones, some languages on the brink of extinction, with only a few remaining, aging practitioners.



I don't know Rickey Stein, but (Doctor) Murray Spiegel is an articulate, dedicated, and fun person. He (and wife Randi) are international folk dancers and avid round singers. Their annual seders, which have been written about in the NY Times, are usually very different, with their home magically transformed each Spring. As described in the Times (and in the <http://sedersforyou.tripod.com> site), the house becomes a Bedouin tent, an Egyptian tomb, a jumbo jet exodus, etc. For the plagues, stuffed frogs (borrowed from friends) may cascade from the ceiling. Themes may include drug addiction, environmentalism, and of course MUSIC. Songs of freedom/civil rights. Beatles variations. Songs from immigrants to Israel. Clever parodies of G&S and Gilligan's Island, Delightful "Mostly Matza" words to *Eine Kleine Nachtmusik*.
