By Car: From Manhattan: Take the Long Island Expressway to Exit 36, Seasingtown Road. Left on Seasingtown Road north towards Port Washington. Pass Route 25A (road changes name to Port Washington Blvd.) then continue approximately 2 miles into town of Port Washington. Left on Main Street (traffic light; gas station on far left corner and post office on far right). Go about one mile to Library Drive and turn right. Library Drive is one short block and forms a T with Locust Avenue. Jean's house is 7A Locust. Park on Locust wherever you find a spot. The driveway of Jean's home is located between #5 and #7. Walk up this driveway to her home.

Berggren accompanies himself on guitar, banjo, and harmonica, and Lynn with guitar and concertina.

Evy Mayer sings and plays ukulele, guitar, dumbek and a host of other percussion instruments. She collects popular songs of the early 1900s, as well as humorous songs, children's music, plus Balkan and other international music.

Lynn Noel has a compelling voice of striking clarity and power, as wide and deep as her repertoire, especially for sea chanteys and flowing ballads of life and work at sea. Lynn's award-winning living history series of "voyageurs, Vikings, pirates, and other traditional women's roles" has toured internationally. Lynn plays dulcimer, percussion, concertina, and string bass; but her favorite instrument is the audience.

Full and Half Scholarships are available in exchange for administrative work done on our folk music weekends (Spring, Fall, and Winter). These jobs are essential to the success of the weekend so please think about the **Fall weekend now!** Contact the Club President, Joy Bennett, <president@folmusicny.org>, 718-575-1906 if you are interested in any of the jobs.

Weekend Chair: A management job with responsibility for the performance of all of the other jobs. On the weekend is the club's contact with the manager of the facility we are using. (half scholarship)

Registrar: Receives, records, and acknowledges all reservations, maintains waiting list, processes cancellations; accounts for money received and reconciles the amount due. Helps greet arrivals at camp--must be able to arrive early.(full scholarship)

Transportation Coordinator: Tries to find rides to and from camp for all who need them. Gets and gives out info. on public transportation if needed. (full scholarship)

Typist/Room Assigner: Types the address list and assigns rooms; sends out the advance schedules. Must be able to arrive early to greet arrivals at camp. It helps to know a lot of club members. (half scholarship)

Baby-sitter: (Depends on need.) Cares for smaller children, particularly during evening concerts. (full Scholarship)

His travels, adventures and reputation are going to be talked about on these lists by the many people who knew him, worked with him and were inspired by him over the last forty years or so. I will not belabor any of that here. Let's just say, we've lost one of our own. And like Preacher Casey said, his work is done. Now it's up to us.
