Come and enjoy our weekend. A preliminary list and descriptions of the workshops are below. There will be more surprises on the weekend, and there may be some changes. Note that some of them suggest you bring an instrument, a tape recorder, etc.

Danny Spooner

- **Brave, Bold Boys**—songs about heroes. Learn some of the historic content behind the songs.
- **These Songs Made Australia**—Enjoy and learn about the significance of these songs to the development of Australia.
- **The British Tradition Transported to Australia**—How British tunes and songs were adapted and became Ozy songs.

Trish Miller and John Kirk

- **Old Time String band**—A get-acquainted session for instrumentalists and beginners alike. Join this jam to pick-up some pickin' points and make music. Songs and tunes will be played with basic chord changes provided. More advanced players will be given a chance to take a break!
- **Clogging, Flatfootin' & Buckdance**—A performance and how-to workshop teaching the basics of clogging steps, what makes them different from other styles of step dancing and some stylistic differences within the form. We will teach basics, demonstrate the steps, and feature challenging combination steps.
- **Funny Songs & Sing Alongs**—Expand your repertoire, append your song book, or just attend and hear some silly and twisted song writing. Warning: some of this stuff may not be politically correct; but it is all in good fun. Many selections have catchy choruses and plenty of frivolity.
- **North Country Tunes and Songs**—Stories, tunes and songs with a sense of place. Having done programs at camps in the North Country for many years, they have drawn from a vast repertoire of favorite tall tales, funny songs and sing alongs from old timer's, who all possessed keen ties to local history, and to each other with selections that reflect lifestyles and heritage from in and around the northern wilderness.

- **Old-time duets**—Learn two to three lesser-known old-time duets, with an emphasis on close harmony and achieving that early-country feel. It will be non-stop singing, and you'll come away with a handful of good new songs.
- **Duet singing intensive**—Using early country repertory, we'll move past simply knowing the notes to working on one or two songs, one-on-one, in small groups. An ability to hold a harmony part, either by yourself or with a singing buddy, would be helpful.
- **Mandolin in old-time songs**—*(if we get enough Mandolin players—let us know if you are one of them)*—Some of the ways the mandolin is used to accompany singing in early-country repertory. This fingers-on-strings class is good for intermediate players who have a fairly easy time learning tunes. Bring tape recorders and a mandolin. I'll provide word sheets and some music and tab.,
- **Country songs with a hook**—Songs from the 1950s country/honky-tonk repertory are great fun to sing in jams. Some of the best have a hook, a lyric twist that makes them memorable. Learn two or three of them.
