Gwilym lived in the USA in the 1990s, and did some folksong collecting in the Appalachian and Adirondack Mountains. His



recordings have been placed in the Library of Congress. Terry now resides in Britttany, where he has made a special study of Breton and other French folk tunes. Be prepared for a fine evening of English, Welsh, American and even some continental European songs and tunes.

The Folk Process

We have much sad news this month.

Sol Weber writes, "Sol Weber sadly announces the passing of his brother Russell (Rusty) at the age of 82 apparently from the effects of drug interactions after a routine procedure. I'll miss him. (My advice---Make sure your doctors, dentists, etc. have exact information on pills, etc. you're taking before adding others.)"

Mike Seeger died of cancer on Friday, August 7th at his home in Lexington, Virginia. He was 75. He was a collector and performer of traditional music. Many of us remember him as a performer in the group, the New Lost City Ramblers. He is survived by his wife, Alexia Smith, his sisters, Peggy Seeger and Barbara Perfect, his half-brothers, Pete and John Seeger, his sons, Kim, Chris and Jeremy Seeger, stepchildren Cory, Jenny, Joel and Jesse Foster and thirteen grandchildren and stepgrandchildren.

From George Stephens: "On August 10, my beloved singing partner, life partner and wife, **Mary LaMarca** died after a five year battle with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease. I believe she died peacefully, at home with her parents, me and her favorite cat around her. Love to all."

Sandy Paton died on July 26th after a long illness. He was 80 years old. Sandy and his wife, Caroline, along with Lee Haggerty founded Folk Legacy Records, an enterprise that has, indeed, provided a rich legacy to lovers of traditional music. Many of us have fond memories of club weekends and concerts where we listened to Sandy and Caroline's lovely voices blending in song. Sandy is survived by his wife, Caroline, sons Robin and David and grandchildren.

Kaelan Palmer Paton died on June 16th. He was 16 years old. Kaelan and several friends went swimming after school in the Housatonic River. On that day the water was unusually high and turbulent. Kaelan, a strong swimmer, jumped in from a high ledge and swam past a dangerous eddy to shore. However, two of his friends were having trouble getting past the eddy. Kaelan went back and helped them get to safety. Then he was pulled into the eddy's vortex. A memorial service was held on July 12th. Kaelan is survived by his parents, David Paton and Catherine Palmer Paton, his grandmother, Caroline Paton, and sisters Linnea, Shannon and Juliana.
