Take the Q 46 bus (This is the first stop and it will only go in one direction) to Utopia Parkway. Get off the bus in front of Citibank, walk towards Utopia Parkway. Without crossing any streets at this point, make a left turn onto Utopia Parkway and walk two blocks to 80th Drive. Turn left on 80th Drive, walk one block to Tryon Place, turn right, look for our house on the left side of the street.

By car via LIE: From Manhattan go to Utopia Parkway exit. Turn right on Utopia Parkway and go about 2 miles to Union Turnpike. Go two blocks past Union Turnpike to 80th Drive; turn left. Go one block; turn right onto Tryon Place. House is on left.

make reservations and tell us in advance that you are coming so that we can adequately prepare for the anticipated attendance. We also need know in advance who will be performing so that we can arrange the program and time slots. Contact Sol Zeller at solz1@optonline.net or (845) 354-4586 to make reservations.

Please bring a pot luck dish to share with 6 other people. We will provide the soft drinks, paper goods, and plastic ware. Please note that this is an ALCOHOL FREE event and this policy will be strictly enforced. Please bring lawn chairs and/or blankets as you would to a folk festival. (We will have a limited number of chairs available for those coming by public transportation.) Because this is a large outdoor area we will have a professional sound system with Don Wade as our sound engineer. (Last year some of our performers had a problem being heard and at their suggestion the sound system has been added.) In addition to the main performance area, there will be a separate area for jamming which will not have sound. We will be having craft vendors exhibiting and selling their wares; if you would like to be one of these vendors, the price will be \$20 per table and you have to bring your own table. Please reserve in advance as the number of craft vendors will be limited. As was the case last year, there will be no charge for performers who wish to exhibit and sell their CDs, and we will provide the table space for them to do so. In the event of rain we will move the festivities indoors.

There is plenty of free on-site parking at the ambulance corps and at the high school directly across the street. All facilities are accessible to persons with disabilities. For driving directions: Take the George Washington Bridge (upper level) to the Palisades Parkway north to Exit 11. At the end of the exit ramp make a right on to New Hempstead Road going east. Follow New Hempstead Road all the way until it ends at Main Street in downtown New City. Make a right on to Main St. and go 50 feet to the very next traffic light where you make a left. This is the beginning of Congers Road. Follow Congers Road for approximately one mile and the New City Volunteer Ambulance Corps will be on your left. For those of you with GPS enter the address 200 Congers Road, New City, NY 10956. By public transportation take the Coach USA Red & Tan Lines bus from Port Authority Bus Terminal to New City. The bus stops right at our front door. Tell the driver when you board that you will be getting off at the Ambulance Corps building.

Full and Half Scholarships are available in exchange for administrative work done on our folk music weekends (Spring, Fall, and Winter). Weekend Chair: A management job with responsibility for the performance of all of the other jobs. On the weekend is the club's contact with the manager of the facility we are using. (half scholarship)

Transportation Coordinator: Tries to find rides to and from camp for all who need them. Gets and gives out info. on public transportation if needed. (full scholarship)

Room Assigner: Produces the address list and assigns rooms; sends out the advance schedules. Must be able to arrive early to greet arrivals at camp. It helps to know a lot of club members. (half scholarship)
