The Folk Process

Marilyn Suffet sends the following sad news:

You have probably heard about the tragic and deadly forest fires that ravaged northern Israel early in December. The fires swept through the artists' village of Ein Hod in the Carmel Mountains south of Haifa on December 3-4, completely destroying the pottery studio and bookstore belonging to Naomi and Ze'ev Verchovsky, the sister and brother-in-law of board member Marilyn Suffet. The fire also damaged the Verchovsky's house and their adult son's house trailer, so now all three are temporarily living in a small apartment until their dwellings can be repaired. The pottery studio and bookstore (with its 15,000 volumes all gone) were their livelihood, and any help would be appreciated so they can begin to rebuild. 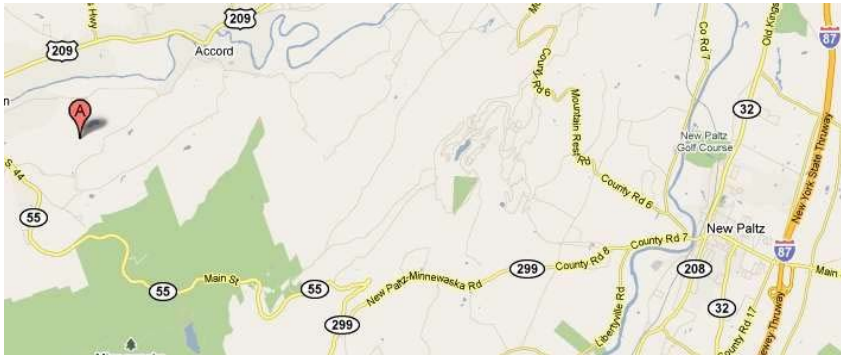
