John McCutcheon: Friday, July 18th; 8pm

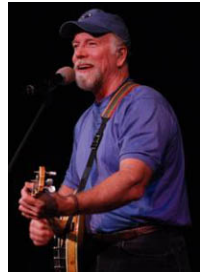
Legends – a series showcasing some of the great performers in various folk fields.

As an instrumentalist, John is a master of a dozen different traditional instruments, most notably the rare and beautiful hammer dulcimer. His songwriting has been hailed by critics and singers around the globe. His thirty recordings have garnered every imaginable honor including seven Grammy nominations. He has produced over twenty albums of other artists - from traditional fiddlers, to contemporary singer-songwriters, to educational and documentary works. His books and instructional materials have introduced budding players to the joys of their own musicality. And his commitment to grassroots political organizations has put him on the front lines of many of the issues important to communities and workers.
