Workshop Leaders: Bill Christophersen – fiddle; Alan Friend – banjo.

Advance Registration Required for EACH Workshop

BEGINNING LEVEL: 2:00 – 3:30 PM, \$20. This hands-on workshop for banjo-players, fiddlers, guitarists, etc who are less experienced playing Southern old-time music includes: roles of different instruments, what to do when you don't know the tune, what to listen for (tempo, chord changes, etc.). Standard old-time tunes will be played in keys of G, D and A.

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL: 4:00 – 5:30 PM, \$20. Similar to the above, but less discussion and more playing. Attendees should be comfortable playing their instruments at a moderate to fast tempo in the keys of G, D and A. Besides standard old-time tunes, less common ones may be introduced as well.

Bill Christophersen is a veteran fiddler of countless bands, and has played and recorded with John Cohen and Tom Paley of the New Lost City Ramblers. His influences include Tommy Jarrell, Arthur Smith, Buddy Thomas and Ernest East. Winner of several regional fiddle competitions, Bill has been a staff musician at Ashokan Dance/Music Camp, Pinewoods Camp, Alta Sierra Music Festival and NEFFA. He has several recordings; his latest is a solo CD, "Hell and High Water."

Alan Friend has played old-time clawhammer and finger-picking banjo for over 30 years. He has performed solo and with various bands at NEFFA, West Virginia's Pipestem Festival, the Brooklyn Folk Festival and more. In addition, he regularly gives banjo and jamming workshops, teaches private banjo students and writes for the Banjo Newsletter, with several tunes he plays posted on its website. He hosted a monthly old-time jam for the Pinewoods Club in the 1980's. Alan's recording, "Had a Dog," was selected as a "top pick" by CDBaby when it first came out.
