### **Performers on the FMSNY porch (in alphabetical order) are:**

**Taylor Aksel Arthur** - Taylor Aksel Arthur is a multidisciplinary artist with a background in classical theatre and theatre for young audiences. Influences range from British & Celtic folk to progressive rock, punk, and metal. Hey-ho, huzzah, and skåll!



**Brooklyn Stoop Singers** - The Brooklyn Stoop Singers will bring to the Porch Stomp lively choruses, tasty harmonies and strong voices wrapped around guitar, banjo and mandolin accompaniment. The group's members have been sharing their eclectic repertoire of sea chanteys, contemporary pieces and songs from the British Isles and the Appalachian Mountains with New York City audiences for decades, individually, and in other bands. They are excited to debut as an ensemble at Porch Stomp.

The Stoop Singers unites Deirdre Bialo-Padin (vocals), Chris Carpenter (vocals, guitar, mandolin and whatever other instruments he decides to bring); Elizabeth Hershon (vocals) and Chris Seymour (vocals and banjo).

**Liz Hanley & Jefferson Hamer** - Liz Hanley is a Brooklyn based violinist, fiddle player, singer and composer. Hanley was trained in classical violin and voice earning a BM from NYU in performance. She was steeped in Irish and American folk traditions growing up in Boston with her fiddle playing dad Andy Hanley and tumbled in the rock n roll dryer along the way. Called "a hallmark of progressive folk-rock" by Vents Magazine, Hanley has toured globally. Hanley's debut album, *The Ecstasy of St Cecilia*, features Jefferson Hamer and Eamon O'Leary of the Murphy Beds. A guitarist, songwriter, and troubadour of many genres, Jefferson Hamer has spent the greater part of three decades searching for a song to sing. Jefferson is immersed in traditional Irish music, playing guitar accompaniment and singing at sessions Swift's, Brass Monkey, and 11th St. Bar. Jefferson's songwriting and lead guitar work is featured on the self-produced record *Alameda*, and continues in collaboration with Boston-based Session Americana.



**Pamela Jean** - Pamela Jean is a fixture in the trad scene in New York. Her versatility and musical background has earned respect among players and folk singers from here and across the pond. Her collaborations with Matt Diaz and Matthew Christian result in unique interpretations of age old tunes.

**Gaby Marantz** - Gaby is a technicolor powerhouse delivering songs of love and longing with a smattering of mischief. Come for the heartbreak; stay for the absurdity.



**Sarah Murdoch** - Sarah Murdoch's haunting, sultry voice seeps into your bones and transfixes you from the moment she opens her mouth. Described as 'honey for your insides,' she channels the power and depth of singers from another era, while maintaining a contemporary edge. Ranging from traditional folk music to original songs played on a baritone

 guitar, she's been compared to Florence Welch, PJ Harvey, and Lera Lynn. Sarah has performed at venues including DROM, Sidewalk, The Knitting Factory (where she opened for Gaelynn Lea), the Folklore Society of Greater Washington, and house concerts all along the East Coast.

**Music the Gathering** - Music The Gathering is an original, interactive, and energetic folk music show inspired by scenario and strategy games. With three-part harmonies, fiddle, accordion, cajon, and guitar, the group performs a vast repertoire of original arrangements across multiple genres, from traditional Celtic and world music to comedic parodies and contemporary folk.



**Debbie Rich and Ron Pecan** - Debbie Rich and Ron Pecan are two local artists who have been singing and playing traditional and old-time music together for many years. They include fiddle tunes, gospel, blues, topical, work, maritime, protest, ballads, love and kids' songs. Some came from centuries ago, where we do not know who wrote them and have been passed down orally, and often altered along the way. Some come from contemporary writers from the mid-20th century up to today. All are the sounds of the people.

**Gaya Sriskanthan** - Inspired by the stories and song of working people the world over, Gaya draws from broad (across time and space) traditions of folk music looking at the lives and struggles of everyday people. She sings old time music, to modern folk, including anti and post-colonial movements. She's joined by Eli Hetko, a talented guitar and banjo player.
