The Folk Process

I have sad news. My partner, Harvey Cort, passed away on November 13, 2022. He was 96 years old. Harvey and I met at a house concert the performers were club members Evy Mayer and Jean Farnworth. He had lovely eyes and an amazing sense of humor. We were together for 32 years. Harvey's long and varied career is described in an obituary on Legacy.com.

His contribution to the archives of folk music began when he met the singer, lutist and guitarist Richard Dyer-Bennet. Together they established Dyer-Bennet Records. A perfectionist, Harvey was proud of the 15 high quality records that he produced of Dyer-Bennet's work. One of my favorite selections is a rendition of "The Golden Vanity." These recordings are now available through Smithsonian Folkways. Harvey was a loving father, grandfather and partner. He leaves behind his daughter Hayley Cort son Daniel Cort, daughter-in-law Julia Cort three granddaughters (Amanda, Genevieve, Meredith), and partner Ruth Lipman. Mark and Rita Hamburg continue their impressive journeys. Mark sent in the following: "For a few weeks in late summer, Rita and I traveled through Oregon and California. The trip took us to three national parks (Crater Lake, and Sequoia and Kings Canyon with our son and his children), four national monuments (John Day Fossil Beds, Newberry Volcanic, Cascade-Siskiyou and Sequoia), two national historic sites (Rosie the Riveter and John Muir), the Columbia River Gorge National Recreation Area, five Oregon state parks and the Oregon Dunes, Mt. Tamalpais State Park in California, two cities (Portland and San Francisco) and in or through ten national forests (Mount Hood, Ochoco, Deschutes, Willamette, Siuslaw, Umpqua, Rogue River-Siskiyou, Fremont-Winema, Shasta-Trinity and Sequoia). We also toured the National John Steinbeck Center in Salinas, the Museum of Modern Art in San Francisco and the Huntington Art Museum and Botanical Gardens in San Marino and were present for our grandchildren's birthdays.

Climate change posed problems. The temperatures in Portland and inland from the coast in Oregon were at or close to 100 degrees. In central and southern Oregon and far northern California smoke from forest fires obscured views, smelled and ruled out some planned hikes as unhealthy and unrewarding. Still, it was a varied and satisfying adventure."

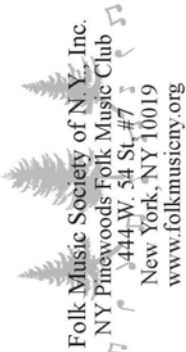
